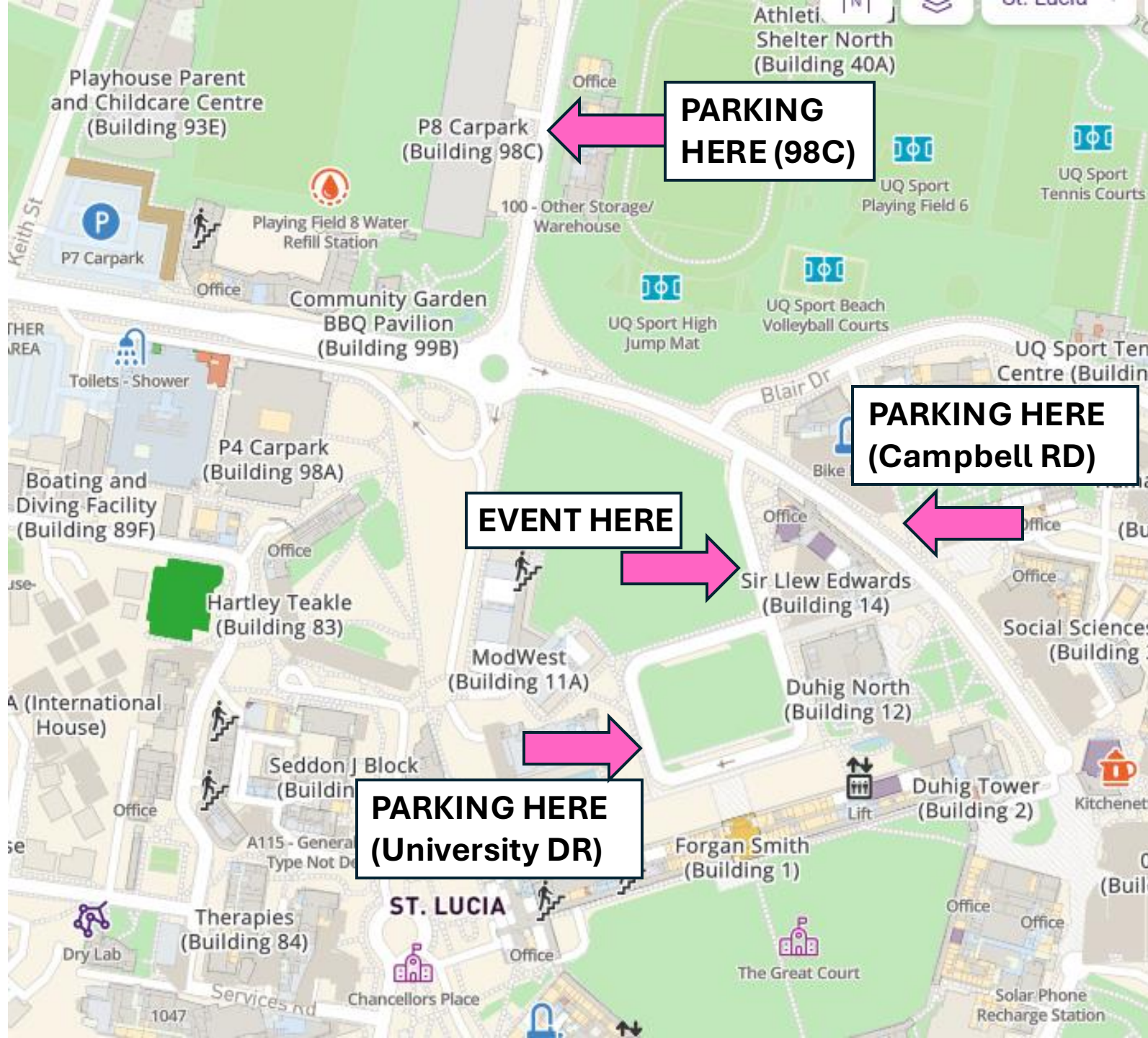

Getting to St Lucia | Parking

- Parking is available on **University Drive and Campbell Road** (including disability parking), but it can fill up quickly. We recommend parking at **98C (P8 Playing Field 8 Carpark)**. It's a **5-minute walk** to the talk venue.
- Information for people with a **Persons With Disability parking permit**



Getting to St Lucia | Public Transport

- You can get public transport to campus. Use [Translink](#) to find your best travel options.
- The closest ferry stop is the UQ St Lucia ferry terminal ([14-minute walk](#) to the event space).
- The closest bus stations are UQ Chancellors Place ([8-minute walk](#) to the event space) and the UQ Lakes station ([10-minute walk](#) to the event space).

Location | Building

- The talk is located in the [Terrace Room](#) in the Sir Llew Edwards Building (Building 14).
- I can access the building from University Drive.
- [UQ Maps](#) is a useful app and website I can use to assist with wayfinding on UQ Campus.

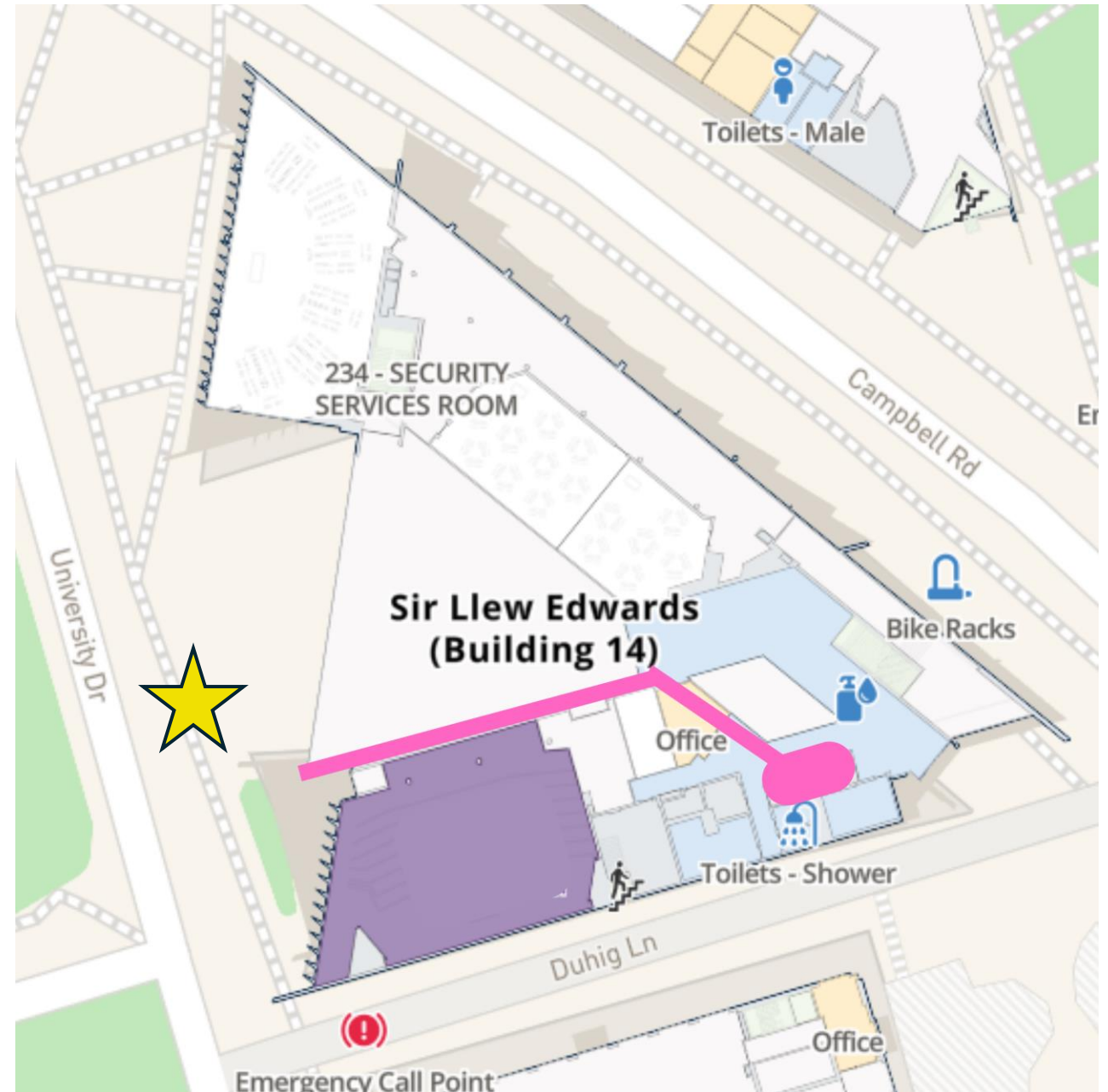


Image description: Students gathering on the grassy steps outside the Sir Llew Edwards Building.



- The talk is held on a university campus during the semester teaching period.
- As I approach the Sir Llew Edwards building, the footpath may be busy with people moving between buildings for classes, or on their lunch breaks.
- There is a nearby greenspace outside the building where many people gather to play sports, socialise or relax.
- I will hear the sounds of people talking, nature, and passing vehicles.

Location | Building

- From University Drive I will enter level 2 of the Sir Llew Edwards Building (pictured), through glass sliding doors.



Location | Room

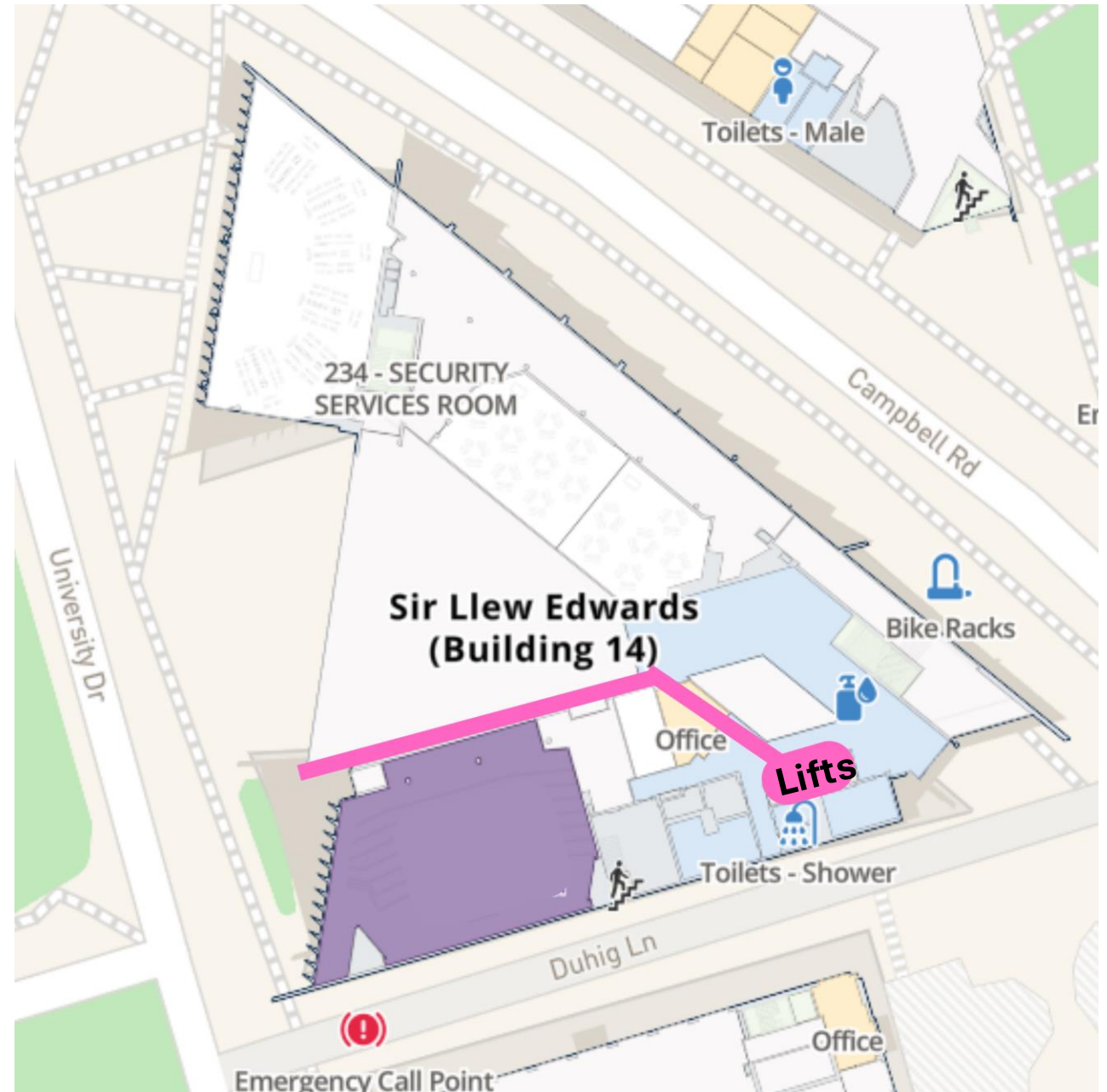
Sir Llew Edwards – Level 2

When I enter through the glass sliding doors, this will be my view:



I will see two lifts to my right.

I will take them up to **level 6**.



Location | Room

Sir Llew Edwards – Level 6

When I exit the lifts on level 6, this will be my view:



I can turn left and follow the hallway to the Terrace Room.

As I head to the Terrace Room, I will also see bathrooms to my left if I need them.



Venue | Seating

- I will be able to access the venue from 12pm.
The talk will start at 12:30pm.
- When I arrive, there will be other visitors in the venue. I can mingle with them, or choose to take a seat straight away.
- There will also be some refreshments available.

Venue | Seating

- There is no allocated seating and I can sit wherever feels comfortable.
- The room will be set up like a lecture theatre, with rows of low, backed chairs facing a stage area where the speakers will be presenting.
- UQ Art Museum staff will be present if I need any assistance choosing a seat.



Venue | Sights, Sounds, Environment

- This event will be held across the indoor and outdoor spaces of the Terrace Room
- The doors between spaces will be open for the duration of the program.
- While the event is held during the warmer part of the day, I may feel a cool winter breeze coming from outside.
- There will be a mixture of lighting at the venue including fluorescent house lights and natural light.

Venue | During the talk

- This event will include amplified sound to project the speakers' voices, and a visual presentation projected onto a large screen.
- LCD monitors will also provide live captioning for the talk.
- I will be able to ask questions at the end of the talk.
